Vision & Mission



VISION

To build Bhairav Dham in the sacred town of Vrindavan — a model animal-welfare sanctuary where every rescued dog and cow receives medical care, dignity and lifelong protection, and where the community is awakened to a culture of compassion, service and coexistence.



MISSION

Rescue & Heal — injured, sick, abandoned and paralysed street dogs and cows.

Care & Cure — through an in-house surgical and veterinary facility.

Shelter & Protect — with humane, lifelong boarding for animals that cannot survive outside.

Engage & Awaken — inviting the public to feed, volunteer and learn.

Honour & Revere — rooting the project in tradition through the Bhairav Ji temple.

Six Worlds, One Sanctuary

The two acres integrate clinical, spiritual and public life into distinct, connected zones.



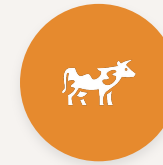

How the two acres are zoned — public life at the front, the clinical core inside, and the Gaushala at the rear.

Medical, Recovery & Care



Operating Theatre (OT)

Sterile, air-conditioned surgical room for sterilisations, trauma and orthopaedic surgery, with anaesthesia, monitors and autoclave.



Recovery Area

Monitored post-operative ward with padded kennels, IV support, warming and 24x7 nursing through the critical hours.



Paralysed & Special-Needs Shelter

Lifelong boarding with non-slip ramps, physiotherapy, canine wheelchairs and pressure-sore care for disabled and geriatric animals.



Isolation (Infected) Shelter

Strictly segregated quarantine ward with its own entrance, PPE, footbaths and dedicated equipment to contain contagious disease.



Dog Shelter — Kennels & Runs

Clean, sunlit boarding with open runs and group play yards for healthy and recovered dogs awaiting adoption.

Community, Culture & Cow Shelter



Cow Shelter (Gaushala)

Airy sheds with dry, raised flooring and an open loafing yard; feeding troughs, a cattle sick-bay and a fodder store. Dung feeds the biogas and compost loop.



Bhairav Ji Temple

A serene shrine and courtyard honouring Bhairav Ji — whose vahana is the dog — placing devotion at the heart of the sanctuary.



Cafeteria

A hygienic, sattvik cafeteria serving visitors and volunteers, with indoor and shaded outdoor seating overlooking the experience zone.



Experience Centre

The signature public draw: supervised feeding stations, education panels, an adoption corner and a small amphitheatre for school visits.

Sustainability & Circular Design

Bhairav Dham is designed to run clean, green and largely self-sufficient — turning waste into resources.



Solar Power

Rooftop solar runs pumps, lighting and the recovery ward, cutting grid dependence.



Rainwater & Greywater

Rainwater harvesting plus greywater recycling for cleaning, gardens and the loafing yard.



Cow-Dung Biogas

A biogas plant converts Gaushala dung into clean cooking fuel for the cafeteria.



Composting & Manure

Dung and green waste become vermicompost and bio-slurry — organic manure for the land.



Native Green Belt

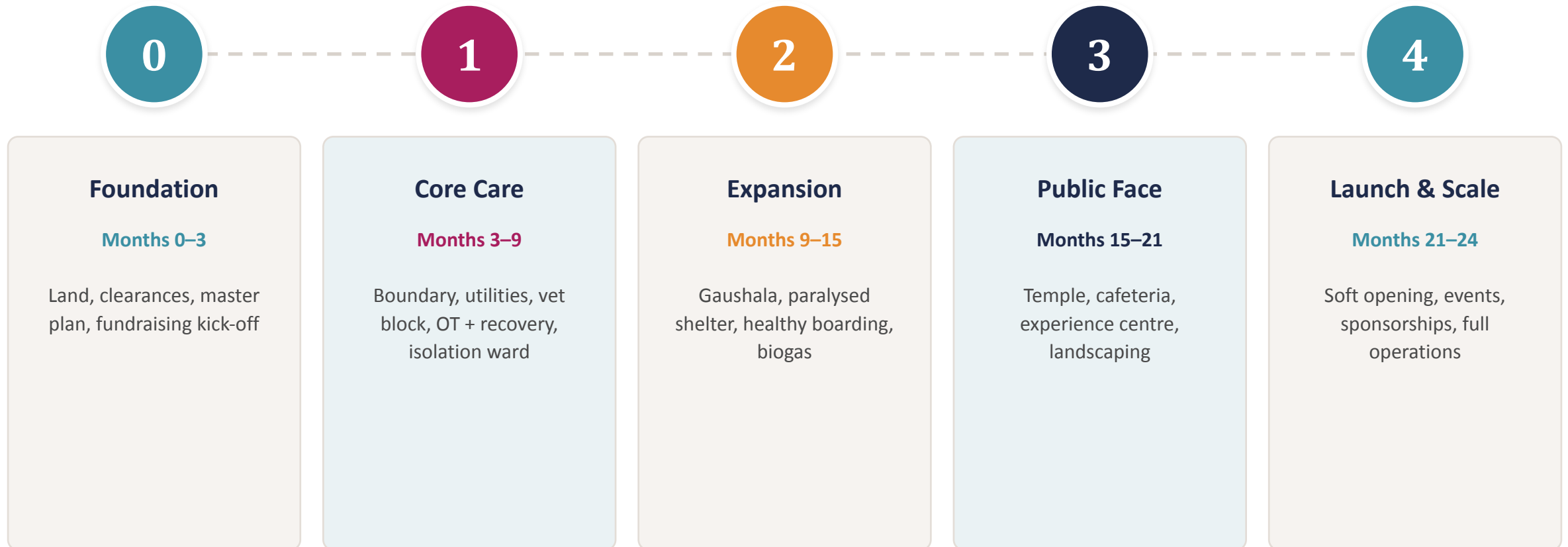
Native tree plantation and a green buffer for shade, cooling, dust control and calm.



Responsible Waste

Segregated biomedical and solid-waste management with authorised, safe disposal.
